

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Never in my dreams could I have imagined that I would be writing to you in the middle of a worldwide pandemic that has turned everything as we know it on its head. Thankfully, with your support, Rales JFS was able to quickly pivot our services remotely so that not one day has gone by that we were not available to answer a call for help from our community. Since March, we have distributed nearly \$200,000.00 in financial assistance to people directly affected by COVID-19; increased by 41% the number of food insecure older adults and Holocaust Survivors who now receive weekly deliveries of prepared meals from the Adele Loeb and Les Nackman Meals on Wheels Program; and absorbed 20 new households in the Jacobson Family Food Pantry. We have had tremendous participation in our on-line workshops and support groups provided by our career and employment services and the JFS outreach team; and when we needed to deliver food to our homebound clients, over one hundred volunteers stepped forward to help.

This year at our annual gala, we will be recognizing our own front line workers, the staff of JFS who are there on the ground every day, managing the challenging times and supporting our community at their most vulnerable points. Please read about what our plans are for this year's virtual Gala, and all our fundraising events this season on page 5. We need your support more than ever so we can continue to provide the necessary resources to our community when most needed.

If it wasn't for JFS, I don't know what we would have done. They say life can change in an instant. That instant this year was COVID-19. We were financially stable as a dual income family. My husband and I were furloughed towards the beginning of the pandemic. Even with our unemployment and stimulus checks, our savings drained quickly, as they did not total the amount needed for our mortgage and food each month. Even when the checks finally came through, it was not enough to cover rent and food each month. The financial assistance we received was enough to cover a couple of mortgage payments and the food we received from the Jacobson Family Food Pantry helped us supplement our food budget. We are now both working and getting back on our feet. I can't even imagine what would have happened to us if were not for JFS. We are eternally grateful to JFS for being there when we needed it most.

### Woodfield Feeds the Hungry

The purchase of food and the hard work of the many volunteers who bagged, boxed and delivered, made the Thanksgiving holiday brighter for Jacobson Food Pantry clients. Many thanks to the event Co-Chairs Larry Blair, Michele Fisher, Gina & Greg Shugar, and to the tremendous number of volunteers that made the event possible. This past year's effort raised a record total of over \$20,000 for the Jacobson Family Food Pantry along with food to provide 145 home bound seniors with Thanksgiving meals. 2020's 12th Annual event will include collections and delivery, but due to COVID-19 safety restrictions, will not allow for residents to participate in sorting or boxing of food.

### Passover Food Collaboration

JFS sorted and distributed multiple pallets of kosher for Passover food that was purchased in partnership with the Jewish Federation of SPBC and its Deborah and Larry D. Silver Center for Jewish Engagement, Hands On Tzedakah, Inc., Boca Raton Synagogue and Chabad of Parkland. This food was distributed to families in need identified through Delray Beach and Boca Raton area synagogues. The large food-service items were donated to Boca Helping Hands, which increased the impact of this initiative by benefiting even more people.

Danielle Hartman, JFS President and CEO said, "Kosher for Passover food items are very expensive, and many families are already struggling with food insecurity. This Passover distribution is another wonderful example of what makes our Jewish community so special."



### Passover Meals Delivery

### Over 100 JFS Volunteers Delivered Passover Meals to 500+ Clients

Over 100 volunteer teams helped their neighbors celebrate Passover by delivering Passover meals and other groceries to seniors living in Boca Raton and Delray areas. As part of the JFS' Adele Loeb and Les Nackman Meals on Wheels Program, each volunteer team delivered between 3-5 meals to over 500 households. Because of volunteer and client safety, we had to forgo the socialization aspect of the experience, as volunteers typically spend time with clients during the delivery. This year, all meals were placed outside of the clients' homes.

Thanks to our dedicated volunteers and JFS Community Partner, JARC Florida, for preparing the meals delivered by our volunteers and to Publix Super Markets for donating Passover hagaddahs which were included in each kit.

### Hurricane Supplies Delivery

Nearly 800 Households Received Hurricane Supplies as Part of JFS' Hurricane Preparedness Program

Over 100 volunteer teams helped to ensure that our vulnerable neighbors were prepared for Hurricane Season by delivering supplies to nearly 800 households within Boca Raton and Delray Beach as part of JFS' Hurricane Preparedness Program.

Each volunteer team delivered between 3-6 hurricane supply packages that consisted of a JFS tote bag, flashlight, first aid kit, poncho, cooler bag, battery powered radio, hurricane guide, magnet with JFS contact info for emergencies, crackers, granola bars, peanut butter, fruit cocktail, apple sauce, tuna and water. Due to safety concerns, all deliveries were placed outside of the clients' homes.

As part of JFS' hurricane prep, JFS encourages older adults living alone, in Boca Raton, Delray and Highland Beach-the JFS service area, who wish to

have someone check in on them before and after a major weather event, to register with the Agency. JFS utilizes pre-screened volunteers, board members and staff to make phone calls and personal visits. 

JFS adult clients continue to benefit from the services of our board certified psychiatrist, Dr. John Schosheim, who has over 35 years of experience. Our partnership now allows us to extend psychiatric services to our child and adolescent clients, who will benefit from the passion and innovation from FAU's psychiatry residents and the attending psychiatrists, Drs. Beattie and Goldman. Dr. Ashley Beattie specializes in children and adolescents, as well as general psychiatry. The psychiatry program is under the guidance of Dr. Stuart Goldman, Professor of Psychiatry at FAU and formerly of Boston's Children Hospital (BCH) and Harvard Medical School. Dr. Goldman expressed, "We are delighted to partner with JFS to bring the latest in evidence based care to Boca Raton and Delray Beach." This expansion strengthens JFS' ability to offer client-centered psychiatric care that surpasses expectations and provides a client experience that is bar-none for all age groups.

JFS is one of the only non-profits serving Palm Beach County that offers fees on a sliding scale, enabling those with and without insurance, much needed access to affordable mental health services. This combination of academia and practice helps ensure that the quality of care provided by JFS is driven by innovation and best practices. Services are currently being offered at JFS' Boca Raton location.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, JFS is offering telehealth services and has immediate appointments available. JFS accepts Medicare, commercial insurances, and self-pay with a sliding fee scale for those who qualify.



### Shop & Share

JFS recently launched our "Shop and Share" Program. The Program matches volunteer "shoppers" with senior "clients" who are unable to shop for themselves. Volunteer shoppers purchase items the client requests and delivers the items to the clients doorstep. Once the pandemic is over and it is safe to do so, the shopper will help unpack groceries and "share" time with their senior providing much needed socialization.

JFS has availability to accept additional seniors as clients. Clients may receive up to two deliveries per month. Additionally, clients must reside in Boca Raton, Delray Beach or Highland Beach, have an active checking account and be willing to reimburse the shoppers upon delivery.

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### Weisman Center's Virtual Programs 'filling a void' During COVID-19

The Weisman Delray Community Center has been a popular venue for community lectures, classes and social activity since it opened in 2010. And despite the facility's temporary closure because of COVID-19, Risa Demato, the center's vice president, said it is still serving the community. "After closing the center on March 13, 2020, we immediately called all 900-plus members to see if they needed any resources or referrals. In the early weeks, we were providing food and product (toilet paper, paper towels) deliveries, Meals on Wheels and a listening ear. As time went on, we knew the seniors needed to socialize and use their minds," she said. "Some people were referred for counseling as needed. The center, working with partners, began providing virtual programming. The biggest obstacle was that many of the members did not have emails and/or check them. We started a call campaign to get updated emails or emails for their children who could help them."

Former volunteer teachers agreed to hold classes via Zoom with assistance with technology as needed. As a community agency, JFS, which runs the center, wants to make sure that everyone is included so its members can be placed on the list to receive emails. The virtual programming is sent out weekly using hyperlinks to make it easy for the less tech-savvy older folks to click and enjoy. Offerings range from cultural such as virtual museum tours and concerts to current events, tech



classes and lessons for online canasta. "JFS believes in developing the whole person, keeping them stimulated, social via Zoom and getting counseling for depression and loneliness if needed," Demato said.

"Therapy can come in many forms for the purpose of offering relief, healing and mental health," said Ron Corbin, vice president of Mental Health Services at JFS. "The counseling department continues to work with the staff at Weisman Delray Community Center by offering counseling services to help their clients navigate through these unprecedented times. The pandemic has compounded their loss of independence, feelings of isolation and depression. Risa and her team have done an exceptional job to work past challenges so their members can obtain much-needed support."

### Diamond Club's Super Hero Purim Party

While the super heroes of the Purim Story are Queen Esther and Mordechai, this year's Feldman Family Diamond Club Purim Party had several other Super Heroes in attendance, including: Wonder Woman, Super Girl, Batman, and the Incredible Hulk and all of our Diamond Club Members, who are super heroes to us! The Feldman Family Diamond Club caters to the socially active seniors aged 75+. Activities include current events discussions and community services projects. Special event parties are planned around various holidays (like Purim!) and day trips to local venues around town.

JFS partnered with the Jewish Recovery Center (JRC) to pull off a Passover miracle in less than a week. The organizations sponsored Passover seder kits along with over 100 meals and distributed them to households of Jewish individuals in recovery, who were unable to make it to a Passover Seder due to the COVID-19 guarantine.

"Passover is a special time for family gatherings, celebratory meals and reflection. Our hope was that this program served as a source of comfort for those residents who have embraced a true journey of freedom from active addiction. The primary mission for this Passover was to ensure that no one felt alone or were without a seder this Passover," said Sharon Burns Carter, Substance Use Outreach Coordinator for JFS. The Lenovo laptops have been pre-loaded with software and applications essential for our mentees to be successful in school, whether in person or virtually. Most, if not all, of the mentees, did not have access to computers until now, which put them at a great disadvantage at the end of the last school year.

Additionally, a recent study by the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, surveyed mentors and mentees across the country and learned that the most important factor in being able to maintain communications in their relationships is access to computers.

Many of our mentees participate in the Paul's Place After School Program in Delray Beach. To accommodate parent work schedules, Paul's Place will have instructors on-site which will allow students to attend school virtually at Paul's Place in a safe (socially distanced)





and supervised environment. Taylor Kilpatrick, Director of Paul's Place After School Program stated, "These laptops will have a significant impact on the lives our students. This will enable us to close the digital divide that so many underprivileged families experience, as well as greatly enhancing their educational experience. Thank you so much on behalf of everyone at Paul's Place-we are so grateful!"


